Steve shared his journey of influencing awareness, policy, and technology to stop the use of mobile devices while driving. The Foundation has influenced distracted driving laws in 30 states. In Michigan, and for this year alone, this change is estimated to have saved nearly 20 lives, as measured by changes in in-vehicle phone usages through telemetry research. Steve reminded us that the Memorial Day to Labor Day period is known as the "100 deadliest days" for driving.

We can help his mission by committing to change our own behavior, using safe driving apps, and writing to lawmakers. Although the Foundation operates very frugally, donations are accepted to advance the mission.
